### From the Area C Director....

New this year is a permanent shelter where you can stay dry, mingle with neighbours, and enjoy a cup of hot chocolate. Admission is free, but donations are always welcome to cover the costs. My thanks go out to the guys for continuing to put on this fun community event!

Earlier this month I was honored to once again be a part of the wreath-laying ceremony at the cenotaph in Townsite, which is part of the observance of Remembrance Day. Even though early forecasts called for rain, the solemn occasion was marked with good weather and many attendees. Remembrance Day, held on November 11<sup>th</sup> each year, is in recognition of the men and women who have served, and continue to serve our country during times of war, conflict and peace. I was pleased, as always, to see so many people turn out for the event.

In November, the qathet Regional District had a second intake of requests for Grants in Aid funding and we were able to give at least partial funding to several worthy organizations in our community. Some of the successful organizations were the qathet Film Society in support of their annual qathet International Film Festival, the qathet Regional Cycling Association for their Duck Lake Trail project, and the Lang Bay Community Club (LBCC) for a new heat pump in the Lang Bay Community Hall. The LBCC request was fully funded by Areas B (25%) and C (75%). The good people at the LBCC provide a space for a lot of fun activities, many of which are put on by the members themselves. In this day and age, where people are turning to online communication and relationships more and more, it's places like Lang Bay Hall that bring us together and allow us to foster relationships with our neighbors. It's worthy of our support.

Each year, in November, the qRD Board elects a Chair to serve for one year, and I am pleased to announce that I was chosen for that position again. This will be my fourth year as Chair, and I would like to thank the rest of the Board for putting their trust in me. I will continue to work to provide good governance for the community, which includes efficient use of tax dollars, creating a safe and supportive work environment for our staff, and providing the services and supporting the organizations that make the qathet Regional District a great place to live. It's going to be interesting in 2026 as we're entering an election year – the qRD Board, Powell River City Council, and the qathet School Board may all look very different in twelve months! If you're interested in running for any of those offices, and are eligible to do so, now's the time to start gathering information and making yourself aware of the issues of the day so that you can be prepared when campaigning begins.
